Physical presence and continuously living on a day-to-day basis in the province of Nova Scotia for 24 weeks beginning January 01, 2022. Applicants using this criterion must be a Nova Scotian: having valid Nova Scotia government issued identification and whose current health care benefits are funded by the province of Nova Scotia.
